Richard Amardi had a double-double of 21 points and 10 rebounds, while Flenard Whitfield also added 12 points and 10 boards for a double-double of his own.</p> <p>Brampton's losing streak continued into Sunday afternoon, as the A's fell 119-113 to the London Lightning. Flenard Whitfield had a double-double of 27 points and 10 rebounds, while Richard Amardi had 25 points and two blocked shots.</p>

New acquisition Emmanuel Jones was the top scorer for the Rainmen, as he poured 33 points into the hoop. Tyrone Watson (17 pts, 9 rebs), Jasonn Hannibal (14) and Seiya Ando (13) also scored in double figures for the Nova Scotia crew. Clifford Clinkscales picked up where he left off last year, as he dealt a team-high 8 assists.</p> <p>With their home opener Saturday night at Scotiabank Centre, the Rainmen took out their frustrations on the Island Storm, leading by as many as 20 points throughout the night en route to a 101-83 victory. Michael Martin came off the bench to lead the Rainmen with 19 points, while Seiya Ando's 17 points included going 4-for-7 from beyond 3-point range. Emmanuel Jones added 15 points and 8 rebounds in the game.</p>

Robinson's 31 points were garnered with 11-for-14 shooting from the floor and 13-for-19 accuracy from the free throw line; Robinson also dished out a team-high nine assists. Another returnee to the Storm, Mike Williams, pulled down a team-high 14 rebounds.</p> <p>Unfortunately for the Storm, they could not duplicate another win on Saturday night, as Brandon Robinson could only muster 17 points in a 101-83 road loss to Halifax. Renardo Sidney (12) and Rashad Whack (10) also scored in double figures for the Storm. Sammy Zeglienski had a team-high 8 assists.</p> <p>The Storm finished Week 2 with a trip to Saint John, where despite 19 points from Mike Williams, the Storm were not able to take a road victory from the Mill Rats, and lost 94-92. Brandon Robinson garnered 14 points, while Nick Evans had a double-double of 10 rebounds and 11 points. Sammy Zeglienski dished out 12 assists on the day.</p>
